RECREATIONAL FACILITIES

- A. All recreational facilities shall be available for use to all employees employed within Rutgers positions (non-legacy University Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey (UMDNJ) positions). Employees employed within Rutgers-legacy UMDNJ staff, faculty positions, and legacy UMDNJ retirees will need to purchase a membership to access campus specific recreational facilities; the memberships shall be posted on the appropriate campus recreational facilities website.

- B. Rutgers University–Camden: Recreational and athletic facilities at Rutgers University–Camden include the recreation center, gymnasium, squash/racquet ball courts, weight room, aquatic center, soccer field, and softball field and are available for use, but are subject to the scheduling requirements of the facility. Rutgers University–Camden offers a variety of recreational programs and non-credit classes to the Rutgers–Camden community. Rutgers University–New Brunswick: Recreational facilities on all New Brunswick campuses, including the Busch Tennis Bubble, College Avenue Gym, Cook/Douglass Recreation Center, Deiner Park, Easton Avenue Fitness Center, Livingston Gym, Lorie Gym, Rockoff Hall Tech Gym & Spa, University Park, Sports Club Field, Class of '57 Pavilion, and Werblin Recreational Center, are available for use, but are subject to the scheduling requirements of the facility.
